

WHAT DID WOMEN IN WALES DO DURING THE FIRST WORLD WAR? **IN NURSING**

The army nursing service, *Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service* (QAIMNS), was formed in **1902**. All its members were trained, qualified nurses. There were also voluntary nurses known as VADs. They were trained by the Red Cross. Thousands of girls and young women became VADs during the War. Many worked close to home, but others were sent abroad, mainly to France, but also to Egypt, Salonika and even India.

GERTRUDE ROSEWARNE

(born 1893), served as a VAD from October 1914 to August 1918. She worked in Abergavenny and Ebbw Vale.
